STEFANIE: – so they know what's going on, too. But you're right, we do bring in not only our staff but staff from other state agencies into the state emergency operations center, have you guys come in and kinda give us a rundown of what you're seeing and what you think you'll see in the future so we can kinda prepare for whatever might happen – like we did last year, a little bit, with Missouri River flooding.
